Obituary of Annette Kaye Anderson Sessa Hall

Annette Kaye Webb Anderson Sessa Hall, age 84, passed away peacefully on April 19, 2026. She was born on September 3, 1941, in Salt Lake City, Utah, to Calvert Webb and Maxine Kinder Webb.

Annette “Kaye” lived a life defined by connection, kindness, and laughter. She married her high school sweetheart, Jerry Anderson in 1958 with whom she had 4 children before moving to Reno in 1971 and later settling in Las Vegas in 1982. No matter where she went, Kaye formed deep and lasting friendships. She had a rare gift—she truly never met a stranger. To her, everyone was a friend waiting to be made. After Jerry’s death in 1986, she married Mike Sessa, whom she was married to for 25 years, and in 2018, she met and fell in love with Tom Hall, who was by her side until the very end.

Early in her career, Kaye worked as a 21 dealer, bringing her warmth and humor to everyone she encountered. Outside of work, she found joy in quilting, creating beautiful, handmade pieces for nearly everyone she knew. Her quilts were more than blankets—they were expressions of love, care, and the way she wrapped people in comfort throughout her life.

Kaye was known for her deep compassion, unwavering loyalty, and a lively

sense of humor. She loved to laugh and brought lightness to those around her. Above all, she cherished her family. She was a devoted daughter, sister, mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother—roles she embraced with her whole heart.

She is preceded in death by her husbands, Jerald Don Anderson and Michael Sessa Jr.; her parents; and her brother.

Kaye is survived by her loving husband, Maitland “Tom” Hall, four children: Steven (Debbie) Anderson, Gregory (Mona) Anderson, Christine (Gary) Tonks, and Kathleen (Steven) Gift, stepchildren Gary (Christina) Sessa, Jen (David) Sessa Schroeder; 17 grandchildren; 28 great-grandchildren; and 3 great-great-grandchildren, all of whom carry forward her legacy of love, kindness, and connection.

Kaye’s life was a reminder that the simplest acts of kindness can leave the greatest impact. In lieu of flowers, the family asks that you honor her memory by “adopting a stranger”—extend kindness, offer a smile, or make a new friend, just as she always did.
