Juanita Walker was born September 25, 1934, to Wilson Willis and Esther Armstrong in Homer, Louisiana. They both preceded her in death. Juanita was reared by her late grandparents, George Armstrong, Sr. and Annie Armstrong in Camden, Arkansas.

Juanita accepted Christ as her personal Savior and was baptized at an early age in Camden, Arkansas.
